Op. of Ct. delivered by Warren, CJ, holding that segregation complained of in these cases is a denial of the equal protection of the laws guaranteed by the Fourteenth Am. In order that the Ct may have the full assistance of the parties in formulating decrees, this and other cases restored to docket and parties requested to present further argument on Questions 4 and 5 previously propounded by the Ct. for the reargument this Term. The Atty Genl of US again invited to participate. The Attys Genl of the states requiring or permitting segregation in public education will also be permitted to appear as amici curiae upon request to do so by 9/15/54, and submission of briefs by 10/1/54.
