Dear Tom:

I think McClung is a really fine job and I am very happy to join it. I have only some minor suggestions:

At the bottom of page 2, would it be accurate to say that the local supplier was a "local outlet for a Chicago packer"; at page 8, Charlotte is in North rather than South Carolina isn't it?

I would prefer the deletion of the material you've marked at pages 12 and 13. I think reliance on Sullivan and McDermott present the danger of expanding federal power without a visible stopping place, and I do think the problem of regulating the goods themselves as a reason for barring products from interstate commerce is quite different from the problem we are dealing with here. Your opinion without that material fully supports the exercise of federal power in this case.
