Furthermore, the testimony pointed out that discrimination by one restaurant in a city could encourage the practice throughout the area because of the fear of competitive advantage to be gained by the XM segregated restaurant in increased white trade. Senate Comm erce Hearings, at 206/ This testimony raised the problem of the competitive disadvantage to which restaurants undoubtedly affecting commerce would be subjected if they alone in their in their communities were required to serve customers without regard to their color or race--a disadvantage in itself injurious to interstate XX already noted the testimony XXXX fact pressed before the Congress to the effect that disc rimination was not limited to any particular State or region but was a problem of nationwide propertions.
