



Mr. Justice:

We have the following suggestions:

1. Page 1, line 7 -- Sub: "refuse to identify other persons as members of the Communist Party."

2. Page 1, line 10 -- Sub: "questions, stating that she would not identify others as Communists if her testimony would hurt such persons or their families."

3. Page 2, line 7 -- Sub: "Even assuming that the unanswered questions encompassed several subjects of inquiry, each of the questions fell within the area of refusal established by petitioner on the first day of her cross-examination, and ~~only~~

4. Page 2, line 10 -- Sub: "refusals" for "refusal".

5. Page 2, line 11 -- Sub: "were" for "was"

6. Page 2, line 12 -- Strike "it".
