Dear Mr. Bandy:

It was very nice to have your letter and to know what you are doing. I have read some splendid things about the Military Police and the training that is being given to them during this war. The Army must be doing an exceedingly good job for I understand the very highest type of men are chosen to have charge of this branch of the Army.

The book that I believe would be the best for you is Schiller, Military Law and Defense Legislation. It was published in 1941 by the West Publishing Company, St. Paul, Minnesota, and the cost is \$5.00. I think, however, that if you write to West about the book and tell them what you told me about being in the Military Police and not being able to find any book on Military Law at your Post Library, that the West Company may send you a copy with its compliments, or else charge you a minimum amount for it. I hope. I can give you some names <sup>of</sup> government publications, if you want them. If so, just drop me a card. One other book that might interest you is by Munson and Jaeger, United States Army Officers, a Handbook of Military Law and Court-martial Proceedings. It was published by the National Law Book Company, 1110 13th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., in 1941.

We will open here in a few days with a greatly depleted faculty and student body. Mrs. Walker was in this morning and she said that Mr. Walker is in the Indoctrination School at Providence, Rhode Island.
